CHAPTER - III ADMISSION TO THE COLLEGE

Academic session of the College normally begins in June and ends in May every year. Admission starts soon after the publication of Board / Council / University Examination result and continues as per rule prescribed by the University / Council.

Aspirant student for +2 and +3 classes should follow e-admission process of SAMS.

A Common Prospectus including e-Admission related information is available in the higher education website **www.dheodisha.in** for reference.

e-Admission

(A) Components of SAMS:

e-Admission consists of a centralized admission process through a common application form (CAF) with help of IT through a web based application software.

An applicant can apply up to 10 choices of college and streams through a single form and will be alotted a seat based on his/her choice and marks in the qualifying Exams taking reservation & weightage into account.

(B) Introduction:

Since Now SAMS e-Admission process is being followed in District Higher Secondary Schools and Degree College of our State.

BACHELOR OF ARTS, SCIENCE AND COMMERCE COURSES UNDER CBCS (SEMESTER PATTERN)

1. The Three Year Degree Course leading to the Bachelor's Degree in Arts / Science / Commerce of Fakir Mohan University shall be spread over a period of three academic years and it will have six semesters. Odd semester (i.e.1st, 3rd & 5th) is from 1st June to 30th November and the examination shall be held normally in the month of November. Even semester (i.e. 2nd, 4th & 6th) is from 1st December to 31st May and the examination shall be held normally in the month of April/May. However, the Final Semester shall be conducted in April and it is desirable that the result shall be published within 30 days and not beyond 45 days from the date of completion of the examination. A student would be required to complete the course within six academic years from the date of admission.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COURSE

A student who has passed Higher Secondary / +2 / Senior Secondary or any other equivalent examination from any Board / Council established by the Govt. of India or any State Govt. or any other equivalent examination recognized by Central Board of Secondary Education/ Council of Higher Secondary Education, Govt. of Odisha/ of Industry or any other Department of Govt. of Odisha.

Those joining B.Sc. Programme must have passed the above examination under the faculty of Science/ Technology / Engineering/ Pharmacy etc. There shall be no such restriction for joining BA/ B.Com stream. Students ordinarily may be selected for admission through merit in the qualifying examination.

Directorate of Distance & Continuing Education (DDCE) would admit students on first come first serve basis.

The Govt. of Odisha may lay down admission process for colleges under its control.

DDCE would decide its own admission policy.

3. COMPULSORY REGISTRATION:

- Registration for the 1st semester examination compulsory and will be at the time of admission. All the students admitted in 1st semester of a college will compulsorily be registered by the University. A registration / examination card will be issued to the candidates admitted and that will remain valid till completion of the course. There will be no need to issue admit card for every semester. The candidates fulfilling the attendance norms, deposit of Exam Fees and other eligibility criteria will be allowed to appear the examination. Students will not be required to fill up any form for the University examination for regular papers. Examination Fee will be collected at the time of admission/re-admission and affiliated Colleges will be required to send the appearing students list along with the requisite fees to the university before the cut-off date for each semester. If a student does not appear for all the papers in both first and second semester examinations, his admission for the said course will be cancelled. Fakir Mohan University will notify all fees to be paid before admission process.
- **b).** For students desiring to appear in any back paper(s), they would be required to fill up the examination forms. Those who fail in any paper in a semester or unable to appear in any semester or unable to submit forms for back papers of 2/3/4/5/6 may appear in those papers in subsequent semester examination within 6 years from the date of admission to that course. A student must clear backlog papers (failed) within 6 academic years starting from the year of admission batch.
- c). Back papers are to be permitted in consecutive semesters for the first attempt to clear back paper. Subsequent attempts will be allowed in alternate semester (example: A student failing in a paper of Semester-I, will be allowed to appear for the paper in Semester II. If he/she fails to clear this back paper in Semester II, he will get the next opportunity in Semester IV, Semester VI etc. only), this practice is to ensure earliest opportunity to the student as well as timely conduct of regular paper exams.

4. ATTENDANCE:

- a). A candidate shall be required to attend at least 75% of the lectures in theory and practical classes taken separately.
- b). Condonation may be granted by the Principal (In case of affiliated Colleges) to the extent of 15% in exceptional cases i.e.

serious illness & hospitalization, accident, mishap in the family or deputation by the college for any specific work for which the period of his/her absence shall not be counted towards the calculation of attendance on the condition that students concerned submit a certificate to that effect from the appropriate authority.

- c). Further to the above, the Principal may grant further condoning of shortage in attendance to the extent of 10% in respect of candidates who represent the University or State for Inter-University or inter-state competitions in Games and Sports or attending different recognized National level camps.
- d). Under no circumstance, the condoning shall be beyond 25%.
- e). This clause shall not be applicable for Distance Education.

5. OUTLINES OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (ARTS / SCIENCE / COMMERCE STREAM)

a). Core Course (14 papers) for Bachelor's degree in a particular discipline:

The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. In BA Pass course, MIL1, MIL2, English 1 and English 2 are also core courses. The Institution/student may refer to the Corresponding Language syllabus for the same.

b). Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (4 Papers):

Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

c). Dissertation/Project:

An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work. A candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher / faculty member is called dissertation / project.

d). Generic Elective (GE) Course (4 papers):

An elective course chosen from an <u>unrelated discipline/subject</u>, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest

beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers.

A student of B.Sc. Honours/B.A. Honours will opt two papers each in two subjects as GE other than his Honours subject. For B. Com. Honours and Non-Hons, the four GE subjects have been fixed. A student of B.A. Non-Hons will opt two papers in one GE subject other than the core courses.

e). Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):

Paper I: MIL Communication (English / Odia / Hindi /

Sanskrit / Urdu)

Paper II: Environmental Science.

f). Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):

These courses may be chosen from the following courses and a College has to choose the courses as per the availability of faculty/suitability of the college, to provide skill-based knowledge. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills so as to increase their employability. A Student opting for Honours would have to take two SEC and a student offering Pass papers would take four papers of SEC. List of SEC Courses offered by Fakir Mohan University:-

- 1. Communicative English and Grammar
- 2. Quantitative and Logical Thinking
- 3. Bio-fertilizer
- 4. Mushroom Cultivation
- 5. Renewable Energy and Energy harvesting
- 6. Fuel Chemistry

- 10. E-Commerce
- 11. Data Analysis and Computer Application
- 12. Applied Reasoning
- 13. Legislature Practice and procedures
- 14. Personality and Life Skill Development

Note: Specific language teachers can be assigned to teach AECC-I. Life Science Faculty can be assigned to Environment Studies (AECC-II), English Faculty for Communicative English, Mathematics faculty to quantitative aptitude and Logical Reasoning, computer science or IT faculty for ICT related courses, commerce faculty for financial skills etc.

6. DURATION OF THE EXAMINATIONS - MID SEMESTER & END SEMESTER:

The Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) examination shall be implemented in Semester pattern. Examination time table for the odd semester will be communicated by 20th June and even semester by 7th December. Each semester examination shall consist of a **Mid-Semester** (Internal) Examination and End Semester examination. Mid Semester examination shall be conducted only for theory papers. End Semester Examination in theory papers carrying full marks <u>above 50</u> (e.g. 60, 75, 80 etc.) shall be of 3 hours duration and practical shall be of 3 hours (for full marks carrying 25). On the other hand, theory papers carrying 50 marks or below shall be of 2 hours duration.

7. MID SEMESTER EXAMINATION:

- **a).** Mid semester examination will be of 01-hour duration for 20/15 marks (20 for subjects having no practical and 15 for subject with practical papers). There shall be no pass mark in Mid Semester examination. The type of questions will be decided by the college authority.
- b). The Mid-Semester Examination shall be conducted and valued by the Teacher(s) who are teaching the corresponding paper or by any external faculty in the college(s). A student who fails to appear in a Mid-Semester Examination will be allowed one more consecutive chance to take the same examination. There will be no provision to re-appear in the Mid-Semester Examination for improvement.
- c). The College has to conduct the Mid Semester Examination between 15th September to 30th September for1st, 3rd, & 5th Semester and in between 1st March to 15th March for 2nd, 4th, & 6th Semester respectively and will deposit the sealed mark foils at the University within 15 days from the date of examination. In case of Mid Semester examination of Semester-I, marks shall be deposited by 30th October.
- **d).** The College authority will preserve the answer script of the Mid Semester examination for 06 months from the date of publication of result of concerned semester for reference.
- e). The College authority of the valuation zones/University authority will preserve the answer Script of the End Semester examination for

06 months from the date of publication of result for reference.

- f). For DDCE students, DDCE shall frame its policy for Mid Semester examination.
- g). A student has to appear the Mid Semester Examination. Absence in a Mid Semester paper will be declared as failed in that Paper. A student who was absent in the Mid Semester examination during both the chances but has passed at the University End Term examination shall be treated as failed in that Semester. Such candidates would be required to appear the Mid-Semester Examinations in subsequent semester as outlined in 7.b.

8. MARK DISTRIBUTION:

c). Projects:

The mark distribution would be subject specific. In general, the Project report will carry 80 marks and viva voce/Seminar will carry 20 marks. The report marks will be subdivided as: Introduction and context: 10 marks; Literature survey: 10 marks; Actual project work methodology: 20 marks, Results, discussion, critical analysis: 10 marks; Clarity of thought and aesthetics of report: 10 marks.

Rservation of Seats

Some seats are reserved for different categories applicants as mentioned below. Such seals shall be filled up subject to the applicant's fulfillment of minimum eligibility criteria.

- (i) Scheduled Caste (SC) 08%
- (ii) Scheduled Tribe (ST) 12%
- (iii) Self / Children / Wife of Ex-servicemen (ESM) 01%
- (iv) Children of Army Personal (ESM) died on action 02%
- (v) Children of Serving Army Personnel (AP) 01%
- (vi) Children of Government Servant / Defence Personnel on

transfer within normal time of admissions (GSOT) 04%

- (vii) OH / PH / Disability (with more than 40% disability) 03%
- (viii) Children of Burma Repatriate (BR) 02%

Notes:

- (i) SC / ST candidates are required to submit recent caste certificate from the local MLA/ MP/ Revenue Officer not below the rank of a Tahasildar. If all the SC / ST reserved seats are filled up and eligible candidates of a particular category are in waiting list for admission, the Principal may increase extra (40% for Arts and Commerce, and 50% for Science stream). In case of SC / ST, reservation of one category is not transferable to the other.
- (ii) Applicants claiming admission under ESM category must submit certificate issued by Rajya /Zilla Sainik Board.
- (iii) A Government servant retiring from service and shifting to a place where he /she wishes to reside after retirement shall be treated as Government servant on transfer. Children of Government servant on deputation to any Government / Non Government agency shall be eligible for the reservation.
- (iv) A handicapped candidate shall be considered for reserved seats only on production of certificate from CDMO / Officer not below the rank of CDMO to the effect that he / she has a major orthopedically / physical handicap to the extent of more than 40% disability.
- (v) Restriction of admission for students belonging to other states: Admission of candidate passing from institutions outside the state is limited to 5% of the general merit list.
- (vi) Applicants claiming admission on reservation have to fulfil the minimum eligibility conditions.
- (vii) No seats shall remain reserved for any category beyond normal date of admission.
- (viii) Reservation is not extendable for admission into the honours classes.

Weightage

Extra percentage of marks as detailed below will be added to the aggregate marks of the last qualifying examination of the applicant claiming weightage.

But in no case the total number of students under this category will exceed 10% of the sanctioned seats.

(i) National Cadet Corps (NCC)

10% of effective mark for candidates holding certificate 'B', 5% of effective mark for candidates representing the State in NCC activities at the All India Level Camps / Courses. (This weightage shall not be allowed to those who have not passed the HS or equivalent examination in their first appearance. Camps / Courses certificate must be signed by competent authority).

(ii) National Service Scheme (NSS)

Direct admission to NSS volunteers who have represented the country in NSS at the international level, 7% for NSS volunteers who have received the National NSS award, 5% for NSS volunteers who have received the State award, 3% for best NSS awardees / NSS volunteer at University level. (NSS certificate must have to be countersigned by the Assistant Programme Adviser, NSS regional Centre, Bhubaneswar).

(iii) Rovers and Rangers (RR)

5% weightage will be given to Rajya Puraskar Awardees in Rovers / Rangers, 10% weightage given to President's Rovers / Rangers. (Certificate issued by Governor for Rajya Puraskar Awardees / by President of India for Present's Rovers / Rangers).

(iv) Sports and Games (SG)

Direct admission for representing the country at international level. 10% weightage for representing the State, 5% for State, 5% for representing the Council / University. (The certificate of the applicants claiming weightage in sports have to be countersigned by Director of Sports, Government of Orissa).

(v) Weightage to Women for Subjects not Available in Local Women's College.

5% of effective mark for women applicants seeking admission with subjects not available in the local women's college. If admitted, they will not be allowed to change their subject during the course.

(vii) Commerce Students Seeking Admission to UG Commerce 5% of effective marks will be given as weightage to the students of Commerce seeking admission to UG Commerce.

Lectures Proctorial Classes and Practical

- (1) As soon as the admission to the college are over, a time table is notified by the Principal starting the date of beginning of lectures. When proctorial and practical groups are formed and notified, it is the duty of the students to find out their respective groups from their concerned teachers on from college notice board or website.
- (2) Students are required to attend their classes regularly and punctually. 75% attendance in every subject is mandatory.
- (3) Students should take their seats before the teachers enter the classrooms and should not ordinarily leave their seats during the course of a lecture. In case of latecomers, they may enter, if the concerned teacher allows.
- (4) Every student must behave in the classroom in a polished and disciplined manner Students not connected with lecturer, should not assemble in front of the class room or make noise of any type. No student or any group of students have the right to disturb the lecturer in any time and this will be treated as gross violation of th,rctol epe rule.
- (5) Girl students should be treated properly. Any sort of misbehavior is to be viewed seriously. Girl students should be allowed to occupy seats in the front rows of seats provided separately for them.
- (6) Students should come to the college as per their dress code properly.

COLLEGE DRESS CODE

Every Student should wear neat and clean College Uniform dress. They should abide by the college dress code as per the instruction of D.H.E., Odisha. The college has accepted dress code from 2005-06. All the students are required to attend the class in the college wearing the uniform prescribed below.

Attendance:

Under the regulation of Council/University, a student in order to be eligible for being sent up for University / Council examination should attend in each subject a minimum of 75% of lecturers, tutorial or practical, calculated separately. The concerned authority may condone the shortage of percentage of a student to an extent of 5% only in exceptional circumstances. There is no law that can help any student falling short of percentage.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- (1) The Academic curriculum of the college also includes cocurricular activities and functions, which are organized in the college in order to train and modify the behavior and outlook of the students.
- (2) Every student is required to extend his active cooperation in bringing success to all co-curricular function organized in the college.
- (3) Student of the college cannot belong to any outside athletic club, society or association without permission of the principal.
- (4) Student of the college has the right to participate in elections to the various societies on democratic lines, but they are

prohibited from indulging in any party or group politics not conductive to academic pursuits which may render them liable to disciplinary action. Politics in the college should be dealt with in a scholarly way in the form of lectures and thoughtful address. The Principal may however, prohibit all students from attending or organising a political meeting if he apprehends a breach of peace of academic indiscipline.

(5) Every Student is expected to participate in the co-curricular activities of the college such as NSS, sports, literary and cultural competitions, society functions and seminars.

GAMES AND SPORTS:

The College provides opportunity both to boy and girl students to develop their skill in the field of games and sports. Steps have been taken by the College to supply necessary sports equipments in different play events. The Athletic Associations (Degree and Higher Secondary wings) of the College conduct interclass games to participate in the inter college competitions organized by Council of Higher Secondary Education, Odisha and Fakir Mohan University. The Athletic Association organises Annual Meet in the month of December/January and awards certificates and prizes to the successful athletes. The college has multi gym facility and there is a trained and experienced instructor. A cricket field has been developed to promote love for the game among students and inter class matches are being regularly organised.

Literary Activities:

Literary activities, such as symposia, debates, essay writing, G.K. Competitions, recitation of poem etc. are organized in different times to develop the literary talents of students.

Articles written by students are published in the wall magazines, published periodically. Successful participants representing the college in inter college competitions are awarded in the Annual Function.

Cultural Activities:

Every year Annual Cultural Functions are observed in the month of December/January. Students can take part in the Annual Drama, National festivals such as the Republic Day, the Independence Day, Birth days of eminent personalities which are being observed with great enthusiasm. Celebrations like Ganesh Puja and Saraswati Puja are aiso observed every year.

Cultural activities and competitions such as dance, song, music, mono action, one act play, annual drama and puja /celebrations are organised every year by the associations constituted for the purpose.

- 2. Duration of course: The syllabus for 2 years course of each subject shall be divided into two parts namely 1st year and 2nd year carrying 100 marks each. The college will conduct one examination at the end of the 1st year class of +2 courses and the council will conduct the examination at the end of 2nd year class for +2 courses. The result of the candidate will be determined only on the performance of the candidate in the council examination to be held at the end of the 2nd year course. Besides there will be three quartered exams carrying 20 marks for each theory subjects and 10 marks for practical subjects, during both first year and 2nd year.

3. THE PASS CRITERIA

- (i) Subject with practical 30% of the total marks shall be diverted for practical examination and the remaining 70%, thereof, for theory. A candidate has to pass separately in theory and practical. Pass marks in Biology shall be calculated taking together the marks secured in both Botany and Zoology.
- (ii) Pass marks shall be 30% for the total marks in theory paper and 40% of the total marks in practical paper, in each subject with 35% of the total marks in the aggregate.
- (iii) The examination at the end of 1st year shall be for 600 marks and examination at the end of 2nd year shall be for 600 marks. Marks secured in the examination to be conducted at the end of the 1st year shall be considered for promotion of students to the 2nd year class. In other words, according to new courses structure examination conducted at the end of 1st year based on the curriculum meant for that year alone. Pass certificate will be awarded to successful candidates basing on the performance in the council exam. to be held at the end of the second year only.

The date of commencement of classes in GHSVS will be notified by the principal after reopening of the school. For details, students can consult Prof. in charge, GHSVS, in any working day of this college.

Any student absent from any class examination without the prior permission of the Principal shall be fined Rs. 100.00 for each paper.

No student shall be considered for being sent up for the Council/ University Examination unless he has taken at least one examination.

A student is not allow to leave the examination hall before held an hour after the Examination is started. Every student should bring his/her Identity Card to the Examination hall, Satisfactory conduct is necessary to take up any Examination. Any irregularities or in relevance noticed in any examination will be reported to the Principal by the concerned Invigilator, the Examinee will be penalized by the Principal depending on the nature of offence.

Any student resorting to malpractice, creating indiscipline in the Examination hall or violating the Examination rules shall be punished by the Principal as he may deem fit. Rules applicable to Council/University Examinations whenever necessary.

REGISTRATION AND SCHOLARSHIP:

Registration:

Every student of the college is it so facto registered student to the Fakir Mohan University and C.H.S.E., Orissa. On admission into the college a student of +3 degree course has to pay registration and recognition fee of Rs. 50.00 to the University and a student of +2 course has to pay Rs. 50.00 to the C.H.S.E., Orissa. When the name of the student is struck off the college rules on the ground of default in non payment of college dues, readmission can be made on payment equivalent to one month fee is required to be produced at the time of filing up the application form for University and Council Examination. Hence the receipt must be kept with great care.

Scholarship and Awards by the Institution:

Different type of scholarships are granted to the deserving students under following schemes by the Central and state Government and the benevolent public.

Junior College Merit Scholarship:

Awarded to the students on the result Annual H.S.C. Examination. Selection is make purely on merit basis and it is done by the State Government.

Senior College Merit Scholarship:

Awarded to the students on the result of Annual +2 Arts/ Science Examination. The scholarship is purely on merit basic.

Stipends to the children of freedom fighters who passed the last H.S.C. +2 Arts/Science are eligible to apply for this stipend.

Govt. of India Post Metric Scholarship to the S.C. and S.T. students are also available and the same is distributed by the Collector of the District.

Book Grant:

COLLEGE SOCIETY ELECTION

RULES FOR THE CONDUCT OF ELECTION TO THE STUDENT'S UNION AND OTHER STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION OF BOTH +2 STREAM & +3 STREAM

- Election will be held only for Students +3 streams. Students of +2 stream are not the member of-the Union and other Students' Association meant for +3 stream. They cannot contest or vote for the different offices of the Students' Union and Association of +3 stream.
- 2. Dress code with identify card of Charampa Mahavidyalaya is compulsory for candidate / Proposer/ Secondary/ Voters.
- Any sort of irregularity will not affect the whole election process except the post concerned.
- 4. For all sorts of indiscipline either by any contestant or his/her supporters, Contestant concerned will be held responsible and he/she will be liable for punishment which may include the forfeiture of his/her candidature.
- 5. Disfiguring of college walls, buildings and of the installations with writing of election propaganda and gross-misbehaviour of the students/candidates to the teachers, the administration and their counterparts may include the forfeiture of their candidature.
- Any student convicted by any court of law can neither contest the election nor propose/second any candidate.
- 7. Each candidate has to submit one undertaking in the prescribed from regarding age, academic arrear and to the effect that no criminal case is pending against him/her on the date of filing nomination.
- 8. A student who does not have at least 75% attendance in the classes cannot contest for any post. No relaxation shall be granted if a candidate produces medical certificate.

- The candidate or any bonafide student of the institution duly authorised by the candidate can file nomination.
- 10. If any contesting candidate indulges in violent activities intimidate any student's to vote for him/her, he/she shall be disqualified and his/her candidature shall stand cancelled.
- 11. If the election to the students' union is not held as per the schedule on the date to protest or trouble created by the students no further election shall be held in the college for that academic session.
- 12. If the gap (winning margin) in between the winning and losing candidates is 05 (FIVE) or less, the losing candidate may apply for recounting to the principal by depositing a sum of Rs. 100/-(Rupees Hundred only) within one hour of declaration of the final result.
- 13. In case of a tie between two or more candidates the election of successful candidates shall be determined by lot.
- 14. In matter relating to the election such as setting of dispute, framing rules, providing additional rules, modifying and analyzing the existing ones and interpreting rules and filling in the gaps in the rules, if any, the decision of the principal is not only final also binding.

THE STUDENTS' COMMON ROOM

- The College provides two common rooms, one for the man and the other for the women students of the college.
- All students of the college shall be the members of the common room. They shall have to pay annual subscription at the time of admission.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college library named Charampa Mahavidyalaya library contains about 20 thousand volumes arranged into different sections and sub-sections. The members of the staff and the student of the college may use the library. The following library rules are notified for the guidance of all borrowers. Library is fully automated with the availability of e-library facilities.

LIBRARY RULES

- The college library remains open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days of the college.
- No book is to be issued without entry in the library issue register.
- Students have to show their library cards along with identity cards at the time of issue.
- A student will be deprived of getting books if the library card is lost. A duplicate card shall be issued on payment of a fine of Rs. 20.00.
- 5. No student is to be issued any book, which is not concerned with his or her subjects of study except in case of general literature like novels/stories etc. in Oriya or English or in any language.
- 6. No student is permitted to enter the library rooms. All kinds of issue and return of books shall be conducted over the counter.
- A borrower cannot borrow more than one copy of the same book.
- (a) Only one book can be issued at a time to a student of +2
 1st year Arts/Science and to +2 2nd year students also.
 - (b) 2 (Two) books can be issued at a time to a +3 1st / 2nd / 3rd year student at a time.
 - (c) Ministerial staff can be issued 4 books at a time.

- No further books can be issued if a borrower has not returned the books issued earlier.
- 10. A student can keep the book for a maximum period of 15 days. A student is liable to pay a fine of 25 paise for each day of default.
- 11. Magazine can be issued to students presenting their identify cards. The magazines will be returned on the same day.
- 12. When the date of return of book falls on authorised holidays, it should be returned to the library on the day the college opens after the holidays, failing which fine for the sole period of holiday will be realized.
- 13. Books in possession of borrowers should be returned to the library before one college closes for long vacation on or before the date notified for time purpose.
- 14. Issue and return of books will be done by the borrower himself and the librarian personally.
- 15. No marginal or other notes or making shall be made in the library books, nor shall any picture or page be removed or torn, or otherwise disfigured. In extreme cases, the borrower shall be asked to replace the book damaged by him and also will have to pay a fine imposed by the Principal.
- The Principal has the right to stop the issue of the certain books to the students.
- Books of reference, maps, course of studies and rare books will not be issued for use at home.
- 18. It is a very serious offence for one borrower to sign for another and borrow books in another's name.
- 19. A book once issued to a borrower will be re-issued to him only if nobody else wants it. Even is a borrower wants a book to be re-issued to him he must first hand it over for necessary entries.
- 20. Any book lost or damaged or mugged by a borrower must be replaced by him. If the book is one of a set or series and volume

cannot be obtained single, the whole set or series must be replaced by the borrower. If the book is not available, the borrower has to pay an among up to a maximum of double of the catalogue or prevailing price of the book. In case where the price cannot be ascertained or the book is rare, the borrower should pay the amount fixed by the Principal.

- 21. The Principal may impose a fine on a student for improper use of a book or journal.
- 22. Books cannot be transferred from one borrower's card to another borrower.
- 23. The librarian is empowered to stop issue and return of book if and when he feels inconvenient.
- 24. No Book will be issued to an out sider without permission of the Principal.

RULES FOR THE READING ROOM

The reading room of Charampa Mahavidyalaya Library will be kept open for the staff and the students from 10 am to 4 pm on all working day.

Magazines/journals will be issued only on production of the Identity Card.

After a magazine or Journal is issued, the Identity Card will be retained by the librarian till the same is returned. In no circumstance will the students be allowed to take magazine putside. One magazine at a time will be issued to borrower for his use inside the reading room.

THE COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The College Magazine "GUNJAN" is published annually. Selected articles of the staff and students in different languages are published in the magazine. It provides opportunity to young writers for the expression of their thoughts and ideas. The Principal nominates Editor-in-Chief and Associate Editors of the Magazine in the beginning of the session.

It is comprising rules, regulations regarding the various activities pertaining to the academic life in college. It serves as a guide to the students, guardinas and staff of the college.

- (c) Discipline is the prime guiding factor of the YRC.
- (d) Services of the volunteers are totally selfless for its no hope for anything in return. No provision exists to provide refreshments or certificate in exchange for the noble work rendered. Divine pleasure in helping others is the sole gain of the volunteers.
- (e) On all matters relating to the YRC, the decision of the Principal is final.
